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The School of Information Management (SIM) is very pleased to announce the appointment of Professor Guy Gable as an Adjunct Professor in Information Systems in SIM for a three year term (2013-2016).

Professor Gable heads the IT Evaluation Research Program in the Information Systems School, Queensland University of Technology (QUT), <http://www.qut.edu.au/>. He is Senior Editor for the Journal of Strategic Information Systems (since 2003), and has served on the editorial boards of MISQ, JAIS, EJIS and others. Professor Gable is a Charter Member of the Association for Information Systems (AIS), has held a range of AIS roles, and has been highly active in the main regional conference 'Pacific Asia Conference on Information Systems' (PACIS), having held 5 major chairs (2013 recipient of the 'PACIS Plaque of Appreciation' for lifetime contribution). He will be the Junior Faculty Consortium Co-Chair at the International Conference on Information Systems (ICIS) 2014 in Auckland, then the Doctoral Consortium Chair PACIS 2016 in Chiayi, Taiwan.

Professor Gable's main research interests are IT Evaluation, Research Methods and increasingly Design Science. His PhD is from the University of Bradford, England (ICIS'91, 1st prize) and his MBA from Ivey Business School, Canada. He has over 100 refereed publications (e.g. Management Science, Journal of the AIS, Journal of Strategic Information Systems, Information and Management, European Journal of Information Systems). Professor Gable has considerable experience in a number of areas that are highly synergistic with SIM's current direction, in particular:

- Professor Gable is Director of Research Training at QUT and has a deep interest in research methods and research methods training. He is an engaged and supportive supervisor and mentor who has won awards for supervision.

- Professor Gable is the leader of a strategic research cluster and has a strong track record of programmatic research based around his interest in information technology evaluation. This research cluster has built an impressive track record of publications, grant application success, international collaborations, and PhD completions.
- Professor Gable has a strong record of attracting external research funding, including both "pure" research grants and industry collaborations. He has been 1st Chief Investigator on a series of successful Australian Research Council (ARC) grant applications totalling several million dollars over a fifteen year period. Most recent of these are an ARC Discovery and ARC Linkage (totaling AUD\$1M) in collaboration with Georgia State University, Victoria University of Wellington, Renmin University of China and Xi'an Jiaotong University. Core Partner-Investigators respectively are Professor Arun Rai, Dr. MaryTate, Professor Ji-Ye Mao and Professor Wayne Huang. This collaboration with SIM through Mary Tate aims at: continuing to evolve a world-class instrument for measuring IS impact and success; understanding how approaches to measuring IS impact and success need to evolve in response to the changing role of IS in service dominated economies; leading and informing the emerging study of IS success and impact in China and globally; and utilising and developing best practice in methods for IT evaluation and measurement.
- Professor Gable has been particularly active in Asia. He is an Adjunct Professor of Renmin University of China and Senior Visiting Professor of Xi'an Jiaotong University's Next Generation Management and Innovation Research Center. He was Visiting Professor at The University of Hong Kong from 2002 to 2007 (1 month per year). Before joining QUT, he was Senior Fellow at National University of Singapore (1986-1994).
